For other variations, check your course syllabus. *A student may enroll in open classes until midnight before the class begins. At the instructor's discretion and with an instructor-assigned permission number, a student may add/enroll in full-semester or 15-week classes through the end of the second week of class or within five working days for any other short-term classes.



MATRICULATION & TESTING

The matriculation process is also known as the roadmap to success that starts you on the right path and keeps you going to arrive at your educational destination.

Matriculation has four parts: **assessments**, **orientation**, **advisement**, and **education planning**.

Assessments & Multiple Measures

The assessment process uses alternative multiple measures to help place you in courses in which you will thrive. In order to be eligible for placement via multiple measures, students must have recently (within the last 10 years) attended a United States high school for three or more years. If you shared this information with us on your MiraCosta application, the Testing Office may be able to use your high school academic information to place you in classes geared towards your success. Otherwise, students can review and share the contents of your United States high school transcript with the Testing Office using either a transcript (unofficial or official) or the Multiple Measures Self Report Update form. Based on how your cumulative, unweighted high school GPA and courses completed meet the multiple measure criteria, some students may be placed directly into transfer-level English and mathematics courses, and some students may also need to take the English and/or mathematics assessment tests.

What You Need to Know Before You Take the English or ESL & Mathematics Assessments

- You must have an application for admission on file before you complete the assessments, unless you are assessing for another college. Submit at miracosta.edu/apply.
- Review your overall high school GPA and the grades you earned in the high school English and mathematics courses you've completed as represented by your high school transcripts. Prepare to share this information on your application or with Testing Services.
- Appropriate photo identification will be required to take the English, ESL, and/or mathematics assessment exams.
- You will receive an assessment score after you complete your exam. Included with your score are recommendations for placement in mathematics, English, and/or ESL classes.
- Students may take each level of the mathematics assessment and ESL exams twice and must wait at least 24 hours before retesting.

Alternatives to Taking a MiraCosta College Assessment Test

- To use high school transcripts, please visit miracosta.edu/ testing to see the list of criteria that will exempt you from taking the English and/or math assessments.
- Provide transcripts from another regionally accredited college showing you've received a "C" or better in a prerequisite English or mathematics course.
- Bring your English or mathematics assessment results from another California community college to the Testing Office. Documents must state the courses in which you are eligible to enroll.
- If you have a bachelor's degree, bring your diploma or transcripts to the Admissions & Records Office.
- If you have achieved one of the following minimum English scores, bring documentation to the <u>office indicated below</u>:

English

- Advanced Placement English (language or literature) score of 3 or higher—Admissions Office.
- International Baccalaureate Higher Level English Examination score of 5 or higher—Admissions Office.
- California State University (CSU) System Early Assessment Program result stating, "Standard Exceeded: Ready for English college-level course work." —Testing Office.
- If you have achieved one of the following minimum mathematics scores, bring documentation to the office indicated below:

Mathematics

- Advanced Placement Program calculus test with a score of 3 or higher—Admissions Office.
- ♦ College Level Examination Program mathematics score of 50 or higher—Admissions Office.
- CSU Early Assessment Program result stating, "Standard Exceeded: Ready for mathematics college-level course work."—Testing Office.

When to Take the English or ESL & Mathematics Assessments

English or ESL & mathematics assessments are offered on a dropin basis at the Oceanside Campus (Bldg. 3300), the San Elijo Campus (Bldg. 100), and at the Community Learning Center (Bldg. A). Visit miracosta.edu/testing for current drop-in hours.

Which is right for me? English or ESL?

- English Assessment—
 - The Informed Self-Placement uses multiple measures to provide a course recommendation for:
 - Students who grew up in an English-speaking home, or
 - Students who were educated in all-English schools from elementary through high school.
- **▼ ESL Assessment**—This is the assessment to take if your native language is not English. This includes those enrolled in the International Student Program.

Orientation & Advisement

Have we mentioned the importance of orientation and advisement? Both are critical, no matter how prepared you believe you are. Log in to your SURF account and use the Matriculation Activity Guide to complete this helpful process.

Developing an Education Plan


First-time college students new to MiraCosta College must develop an education plan with an academic counselor to be eligible for priority enrollment. In order to maintain priority enrollment, students must have completed a comprehensive education plan with a counselor prior to completion of 15 units or a third semester (whichever comes first). An education plan is an important tool to help students attain their goals without wasted time and effort. Education plans outline a suggested pathway for students based on their major, transfer plans, or other objectives. These plans allow students to determine how long it will take to complete a program of study and to be sure that all program requirements can be met within a particular period of time. Students can develop options for educational plans on myEdPlan in SURF but to maintain priority enrollment you must meet with a counselor. Counseling and career planning services are available to help you make informed choices concerning the programs and courses available. Contact the Counseling Department for details at 760.795.6670.

Exemptions from the Matriculation Process

- You have already earned an associate degree or higher; or
- You were exempt during a previous semester; or
- You have already attended another college and noted on your MiraCosta College application one of the following as an educational goal:
 - Discover or formulate career interests, plans, and goals
 - Prepare for a new career or acquire new job skills
 - Advance or update skills in your current career
 - Maintain a certificate or license
 - Personal interest, with no intention to earn a certificate or degree or transfer to another college or university
 - Complete credits for a high school diploma or GED

Students can challenge or appeal any step in the matriculation process by contacting the Dean of Admissions & Student Support at 760.795.6893.

ENROLLING IN CLASSES

After MiraCosta College processes your application, you will receive an email with information about **SURF**, our online enrollment system, accessible at **surf.miracosta.edu**. The application processing typically takes two business days.

You'll use **SURF** to enroll in your classes, but first, you must log in and set up a password. Do this online at **surf.miracosta.edu**, after your application is processed.

Enrollment Groups

Find the enrollment group to which you belong and then reference the chart on page 10 to find your exact enrollment date.

Group A:

Special populations

Students in this group include:

- Veterans receiving VA benefits or who have been discharged from the military within the last four years.[†]
- Homeless or foster youth.‡
- EOPS, DSPS, and CalWORKs students.‡
- Active duty military.§

To receive and maintain priority enrollment, new and continuing Group A students must do the following:

- Complete assessments, orientation, and advisement;
- Veterans and active duty military must complete a comprehensive education plan within their first semester at MiraCosta College. Others in Group A must complete an education plan within two semesters;
- Maintain good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA;
- Complete at least 50 percent of enrolled units; and
- Not exceed 90 degree-applicable units. (Students in the bachelor of science in biomanufacturing degree program are exempt from the 90 unit limitation.)

- † Proof of discharge date, California residence, and previous college enrollments may be required. Veterans who have been discharged within the last 15 years and have not taken advantage of priority enrollment for more than four years may request priority enrollment through the Admissions & Records Office.
- [‡]Priority within these groups is not automatic and students must be verified by the EOPS or DSPS offices. Homeless students may contact Financial Aid for verification.
- Must show proof of military ID and request priority enrollment through the Admissions & Records Office.

Group B: All other matriculated continuing, new, and returning students

To receive and maintain priority enrollment, new and continuing Group B students must do the following:

- Complete assessments, orientation, and advisement;
- Complete an education plan prior to completion of 15 units or a third semester, whichever comes first;
- Maintain good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA;
- Complete at least 50 percent of enrolled units; and
- 🥒 Not exceed 90 degree-applicable units. (Students in the bachelor of science in biomanufacturing degree program are exempt from the 90 unit limitation.)

Group C: Continuing, new, and returning students who have not matriculated (including those in Group A and Group B)

Group D: Probationary students

Any student who has been on probation for at least two consecutive semesters, including students on academic probation (GPA-based) or progress probation (based on the percentage of courses completed with an evaluative grade).

Group E:

Students over 90 units

Students who have completed more than 90 units with a grade of A-F, P, or NP. Courses considered "basic skills" will not be counted toward the completion of units in this category (although they will count toward accumulation of units in Groups B and C).

Group F:

Concurrently enrolled high school students

Concurrently enrolled high school students are restricted from enrolling early and may only enroll approximately two weeks prior to the start of the term.

Enrollment Appointment Times

All students must check **SURF** at **surf.miracosta.edu** to find their enrollment time.

The number of units you have completed at MiraCosta College determines your enrollment priority. For Groups B and C, this includes all courses completed, including basic skills and ESL classes. Students who have completed 90.5 units or more in degree applicable courses will be assigned to Group E.

Appointments are assigned randomly within each group and start at 8 a.m. You may enroll on your appointment date and time or any time after throughout the enrollment period.

FINANCIAL AID

✓ Three Reasons to Fill Out the FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for the following:

- 1. Federal Financial Aid programs available
 - Grants like Pell & FSEOG: free money that does not need to be repaid.
 - Federal Work Study: an on-campus part-time job program.
 - Direct Loans: federal education loans that typically have a good interest rate and require repayment after finishing school.
- 2. State Financial Aid programs available
 - California College Promise Grant (CCPG): formerly known as Board of Governors (BOG) Fee Waiver, which waives tuition costs.
 - Cal Grants: free grant money for academically and financially eligible students that file a FAFSA prior to the March 2 priority filing date.
 - Full Time Student Success Grant (FTSSG): free grant money for Cal Grant students enrolling in at least 12 units.
- 3. Local Financial Aid programs available
 - The MiraCosta College Promise program: free grant money that covers mandatory fees and assists with books.

Undocumented Students

If you are an undocumented student and cannot complete the FAFSA, you may complete the California Dream Act Application at **dream.csac.ca.gov** to determine eligibility for state and local programs.

Important

- Aid eligibility is based on units enrolled as of the fall semester September 2 add/drop date. Recalculations are not made after that point. This date applies to all courses including late start courses.
- Students who withdraw after the add/drop date may be required to repay a portion of their financial aid funds.

Once your To-Do List is complete, your file will be reviewed to confirm eligibility. Reviews can take between 3-6 weeks to complete.

Financial aid is paid through BankMobile disbursement services. You'll receive an email and a green envelope in the mail with information on how to set up a payment method.

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GENERAL EDUCATION

Students at MiraCosta College can choose to follow one of three general education patterns.

Plan A is for students not intending to transfer but who want to earn an associate degree. Plan A will satisfy general education requirements at MiraCosta College but will not satisfy all general education requirements for transfer to a CSU or UC campus and is not intended for students transferring to a four-year institution. B

Plan B is for students transferring to a California State University (CSU) campus.
