

THE PLACEMENT PROCESS

The MiraCosta College placement process provides you with the information needed to get started in the math and English courses that best support your educational pathway.

Complete the placement process in a variety of ways:

- MiraCosta Application
 - The MiraCosta CCCApply application may ask you to provide the following:
 - High school GPA
 - Highest high school math/English course completed
 - High school math/English coursework and grades
 - To help with this step, have your high school transcript information accessible while applying. Students who provide this information will receive an email with their math and English placement information within a few days. This placement notification is also available in the Message Center located in your SURF Student Center.
- Didn't provide information on the MiraCosta application? Submit any of the following to Testing Services to complete the placement process:
 - Official or unofficial high school transcript
 - Multiple Measures Self-Report Update Form. The form is available at miracosta.edu/testing or in-person at one of our three campus locations.

Forms and/or high school transcripts may be emailed to **testing@miracosta.edu** or submitted in-person at one of our three campus locations.

If you would like information and/or access to math and English courses outside of your placement, you may visit the Testing Services office or webpage to learn about our Guided Self-Placement process. Some students may still need to take an Accuplacer ESL assessment for English/ESL placement.

Know Your Rights Under AB 705

Signed into law, Assembly Bill (AB) 705 requires California community colleges to maximize the probability that students will enter and complete transfer-level coursework in English and math within a one-year time frame. AB 705 requires that colleges use one or more of the following measures for placement into math and English courses:

- High school Grade Point Average (GPA)
- High school coursework
- High school grades

The placement process is the first step in matriculation (also known as the roadmap to success). It starts you on the right path and keeps you going to arrive at your educational destination. Matriculation has four parts: placement, orientation, advisement, and education planning.

SPARTAN PREP & SPARTAN START

Spartan Prep is a guide for students to complete online orientation and advisement and develop a first semester education plan. Students will be introduced to college terminology, academic programs, and student support services, along with planning tools that will help students succeed at MiraCosta College.

DEVELOP AN EDUCATION PLAN

An education plan is an important tool to help students attain their goals without wasted time and effort. The plans outline a suggested pathway for students based on their major, transfer goals, or other objectives.

Eduction plans allow students to determine how long it will take to complete a program of study and to be sure that all program requirements can be met within a particular period of time. Students can develop options for education plans on **myEdPlan** in **SURF**. However, to maintain priority registration, students must:



- Meet with a counselor.
- Complete a comprehensive education plan prior to completion of 15 units or a third semester (whichever comes first).













FINANCIAL AID

✓ Three Reasons to Apply for Financial Aid

- 1. Federal Financial Aid programs available
 - Grants like Pell & FSEOG: free money that does not need to be repaid.
 - **Federal Work Study:** an on-campus, part-time job program.
 - Direct Loans: federal education loans that typically have a good interest rate and require repayment after finishing school.
- 2. State Financial Aid programs available
 - California College Promise Grant (CCPG): formerly known as Board of Governors (BOG) Fee Waiver, which waives tuition costs.
 - Cal Grants: free grant money for academically and financially eligible students that file a FAFSA prior to the March 2 priority filing date.
 - Student Success Completion Grant: free grant money for Cal Grant students enrolling in at least 12 units.
- 3. Local Financial Aid programs available
 - MiraCosta College Promise program: free grant money that covers tuition and mandatory fees for two years for all first-time, full-time students.
 - Scholarships: free money available for students, including undocumented and international students.

Undocumented Students

If you are an undocumented student and cannot complete the FAFSA, you may complete the California Dream Act Application at **dream.csac.ca.gov** to determine eligibility for state and local programs.

Important

- Aid eligibility is based on units enrolled as of the add/drop date.
 Recalculations are not made after that point. This date applies to all courses including late-start courses.
- Students who withdraw after the add/drop date may be required to repay a portion of their financial aid funds.

Additional documents will be requested via the **SURF** To-Do List. Check your To-Do List often.

4 Review

Once your To-Do List is complete, your file will be reviewed to confirm eligibility. Reviews can take between 3-6 weeks to complete.

⁵ Payment

Financial aid is paid through BankMobile disbursement services. You'll receive an email and an information packet in the mail with instructions on how to receive your financial aid.

REGISTER FOR CLASSES

After MiraCosta College processes your application (typically takes two business days), you will receive an email with information about **SURF**, our online registration system accessible at **surf.miracosta.edu**. You must log in and set up a password. Then you'll use **SURF** to register for your classes.

Registration Groups

Find the registration group (A, B, C, D, E, or F) to which you belong on pages 11-12 and then reference the chart on page 13 to find your exact registration date.

Group A:

Special populations

Students in this group include:

- Veterans receiving VA benefits or who have been discharged from the military within the last four years.[†]
- Homeless or foster youth.‡
- EOPS, DSPS, and CalWORKs students.‡
- Active duty military.§

To receive and maintain priority registration, new and continuing Group A students must do the following:

- Complete placement process, orientation, and advisement;
- Veterans and active duty military must complete a comprehensive education plan within their first semester at MiraCosta College. Others in Group A must complete an education plan within two semesters;
- Maintain good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA and complete at least 50 percent of enrolled units (excludes homeless, foster youth); and
- Not exceed 90 degree-applicable units. (Students in the bachelor of science in biomanufacturing degree program, homeless, foster youth, and DSPS are exempt from the 90 unit limitation.)














Group B: All other matriculated continuing, new, and returning students

To receive and maintain priority enrollment, new and continuing Group B students must do the following:

- Complete placement process, orientation, and advisement;
- Complete an education plan prior to completion of 15 units or a third semester, whichever comes first;
- Maintain good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA and complete at least 50 percent of enrolled units (excludes homeless, foster youth); and
- Not exceed 90 degree-applicable units. (Students in the bachelor of science in biomanufacturing degree program, homeless, foster youth, and DSPS are exempt from the 90 unit limitation.)

Group C:

Continuing, new, and returning students who have not matriculated (including those in Group A and Group B) and students who have previously earned a bachelor's degree

Group D: Probationary students

Any student who has been on probation for at least two consecutive semesters, including students on academic probation (GPA-based) or progress probation (based on the percentage of courses completed with an evaluative grade).

Group E:

Students over 90 units

Students who have completed more than 90 degree-applicable units with a grade of A-F, P, or NP. Courses considered basic skills will not be counted toward the completion of units in this category (although they will count toward accumulation of units in Groups B and C).

Group F:

Concurrently enrolled high school students

Concurrently enrolled high school students are restricted from enrolling early and may only enroll approximately two weeks prior to the start of the term.

Registration Appointment Times

All students must check **SURF** at **surf.miracosta.edu** to find their registration time.

The number of units you have completed at MiraCosta College determines your registration priority. For Groups B and C, this includes all courses completed, including basic skills and ESL classes. Students who have completed 90.5 units or more in degree applicable courses will be assigned to Group E.

Appointments are assigned randomly within each group and start at 8 a.m. You may register on your appointment date and time or any time after throughout the registration period.

IGETC is not a UC admission requirement but is advantageous to most transfer students. Students are strongly advised to work with a MiraCosta College counselor to develop an educational plan that includes general education and major preparation course work specific to the intended UC campus. Certification of IGETC, including Area TC, Oral Communication, is an admission requirement for the California State University system, when students are completing an Associate Degree for Transfer and using IGETC to fulfill the general education component of this degree.

All courses on IGETC must be completed with a "C" or better. A "P" (pass) is acceptable, but UC permits no more than 14 semester transferable units to be completed on a pass/no pass basis.

UC credit may be limited for some courses. For example, no credit is given for an introductory course if it is taken after a more advanced college course. Credit may also be limited for courses with overlapping content. In addition, duplicate credit will not be awarded for the honors and non-honors versions of a course. UC credit limitations are noted on the catalog course descriptions.
