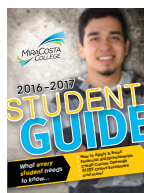

# ADMISSION

## Who May Attend MiraCosta?

Almost anyone! If you are 18 years of age or older; have a high school diploma or equivalent; or are a high school sophomore, junior or senior ready for the challenge of college work, then you are eligible for admission!

Everything you need to know about applying is at [miracosta.edu/apply](http://miracosta.edu/apply).

But here are some highlights:

- Currently enrolled MiraCosta College student** Check for your enrollment date on page 11, go to the course listings and select your classes based on your enrollment date and time.
- First-time college student** Complete the online Application for Admission at [miracosta.edu/apply](http://miracosta.edu/apply). Take the English or ESL & mathematics assessments and complete orientation and advisement (see pages 6-8). New students must also develop an education plan on **SURF**.
- Returning MiraCosta College student not currently enrolled and have missed two consecutive primary terms (falls/spring)** Complete the online Application for Admission at [miracosta.edu/apply](http://miracosta.edu/apply) and see pages 6-8 for information on assessments and orientation.
- New to MiraCosta College, but with previous college experience** Complete the online Application for Admission at [miracosta.edu/apply](http://miracosta.edu/apply). If you've taken a class at another college and want to use it to clear a course prerequisite, complete the Prerequisite/Priority Enrollment Form at [miracosta.edu/forms](http://miracosta.edu/forms) and send your transcript to Admissions & Records.
- Current high school sophomore, junior or senior** Complete the online Application for Admission at [miracosta.edu/apply](http://miracosta.edu/apply). Submit the Concurrent Enrollment Permit, signed by a parent or guardian and your high school principal. Forms are available at [miracosta.edu/forms](http://miracosta.edu/forms).

# MATRICULATION & TESTING

Some call it the matriculation process. It's also known as the roadmap to success and it starts you on the right path and keeps you going with what you need to arrive at your educational destination.

**Matriculation** has four parts: **assessments, orientation, advisement** and **education planning**.

## Assessments & Multiple Measures

The assessment process uses alternative multiple measures to help place you in courses in which you will thrive. The first step is to review and share the contents of your high school transcript with the Testing Office. Based on how your high school GPA and courses completed meet the criteria listed on [miracosta.edu/testing](http://miracosta.edu/testing), some students may be placed directly in transfer-level English and mathematics courses, and some students may also need to take the English and/or mathematics assessment tests.

### What You Need to Know Before You Take the English or ESL & Mathematics Assessments

- You must have an Application for Admission on file before you complete the assessments, unless you are assessing for another college. Submit at [miracosta.edu/apply](http://miracosta.edu/apply).
- Review your overall high school GPA and the grades you earned in the high school English and mathematics courses you've completed as represented by your high school transcripts. Prepare to share this information with Testing Services (see page 7).
- Appropriate photo identification will be required to take the English, ESL and/or mathematics assessment exams.
- Three words of advice before you take any assessment exams: **review, review, review!** How well you do on these tests determines what classes you will be able to take. Learn how to prepare at [miracosta.edu/brushup](http://miracosta.edu/brushup), where you can also find info on our Bridge to Success in Math Program.
- Students taking the mathematics assessment exam can choose between algebra readiness, elementary algebra, intermediate algebra or pre-calculus.
- You will receive an assessment score immediately after you complete your exam. Included with your score are recommendations for placement in mathematics, English and ESL classes.
- MiraCosta students may take each level of the English, ESL and mathematics assessment exams twice and must wait at least 24 hours before retesting.

## When to Take the English or ESL & Mathematics Assessments

English or ESL & mathematics assessments are offered on a drop-in basis at the Oceanside Campus (Bldg. 3300), the San Elijo Campus (Bldg. 100) and at the Community Learning Center (Bldg. A). Visit [miracosta.edu/testing](http://miracosta.edu/testing) for current drop-in hours.

### Which is right for me? English or ESL?

#### English Assessment—

This assessment measures the reading and writing skills of:

- ◆ Students who grew up in an English-speaking home, or
- ◆ Students who were educated in all-English schools from elementary through high school.

◆ **ESL Assessment**—This is the assessment to take if your native language is not English. This includes those enrolled in the International Student Program.

## Alternatives to Taking a MiraCosta College Assessment Test

- ◆ To use high school transcripts, please visit [miracosta.edu/testing](http://miracosta.edu/testing) to see the list of criteria that will exempt you from taking the English and/or math assessments.
- ◆ Provide transcripts from another regionally accredited college showing you've received a "C" or better in a prerequisite English or mathematics course.
- ◆ Bring your English or mathematics assessment results from another California community college to the Testing Office. Documents must state the courses in which you are eligible to enroll.
- ◆ If you have a bachelor's degree, bring your diploma or transcripts to the Admissions and Records Office.
- ◆ If you have achieved one of the following minimum English scores, bring documentation to the office indicated below:  
A = Admissions & Records Office T = Testing Office

### English

- ◆ **Advanced Placement English** (language or literature) score of 3 or higher. A
- ◆ **International Baccalaureate Higher Level English Examination** score of 5 or higher. A
- ◆ **California State University (CSU) System Early Assessment Program** result stating, "Standard Exceeded: Ready for English College-level course work." T
- ◆ **CSU system English Placement Test** score of 151 or higher. T
- ◆ **University of California Analytical Writing Placement Examination** passing score. T

- ◆ If you have achieved one of the following minimum mathematics scores, bring documentation to the office indicated below: A = Admissions & Records Office T = Testing Office

### Mathematics

- ◆ **Advanced Placement Program** calculus test with a score of 3 or higher. A
- ◆ **College Level Examination Program** mathematics score of 50 or higher. A
- ◆ **CSU Early Assessment Program** result stating: "Standard Exceeded: Ready for mathematics college-level course work." T
- ◆ **CSU system Entry Level Mathematics** exam score of 50 or higher. T



# Orientation & Advisement

Have we mentioned the importance of orientation and advisement? Both are critical, no matter how prepared you believe you are. Visit [miracosta.edu/orientation](http://miracosta.edu/orientation) to complete the orientation and advisement requirements.

## Developing an Education Plan

First-time college students new to MiraCosta College must develop an education plan with an academic counselor to be eligible for priority enrollment. In order to maintain priority enrollment, students must have completed with a counselor a comprehensive education plan prior to completion of 15 units or third semester (whichever comes first). An education plan is an important tool to help students attain their goals without wasted time and effort. Education plans outline a suggested pathway for students based on their major, transfer plans or other objectives. These plans allow students to determine how long it will take to complete a program of study and to be sure that all program requirements can be met within a particular period of time. Students can develop options for educational plans on *myEdPlan* in **SURF** but to maintain priority enrollment you must meet with a counselor. Counseling and career planning services are available to help you make informed choices concerning the programs and courses available. ## Exemptions from the Matriculation Process

- You have already earned an associate degree or higher; or
- You were exempt during a previous semester; or
- You have already attended another college and noted on your MiraCosta College application one of the following as an educational goal:
  - ◆ Discover or formulate career interests, plans and goals
  - ◆ Prepare for a new career or acquire new job skills
  - ◆ Advance or update skills in your current career
  - ◆ Maintain a certificate or license
  - ◆ Personal interest, with no intention to earn a certificate or degree or transfer to another college or university
  - ◆ Complete credits for a high school diploma or GED

# ENROLLING IN CLASSES

After MiraCosta College processes your application, you will receive an email with information about **SURF**, our online enrollment system, accessible at [surf.miracosta.edu](http://surf.miracosta.edu). Application processing typically takes 3–5 business days.

You'll use **SURF** to enroll in your classes. But first, you must log in and set up a password. Do this online at [surf.miracosta.edu](http://surf.miracosta.edu), after your application is processed.

## Enrollment Groups

Find the enrollment group to which you belong and then reference the chart on page 11 to find your exact enrollment date and time. Your enrollment date and time will also be emailed to you.

### Group A: Special populations

#### Students in this group include:

- ✓ Veterans receiving VA benefits or who have been discharged from the military within the last four years.<sup>†</sup>
- ✓ Foster youth.<sup>‡</sup>
- ✓ EOPS, DSPS and CalWORKs students.<sup>‡</sup>
- ✓ Active duty military.<sup>§</sup>

#### To receive and maintain priority enrollment, new and continuing Group A students must do the following:

- ✓ Complete assessments, orientation and advisement (*see pages 6–8*);
- ✓ Veterans and active duty military must complete a comprehensive education plan within their first semester at MiraCosta College (*see page 8 for details*). Others in Group A must complete an education plan within two semesters (*see page 8 for details*);
- ✓ Maintain good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA;
- ✓ Complete at least 50 percent of enrolled units; and
- ✓ Not exceed 90 degree-applicable units.

<sup>§</sup>Must show proof of military ID and request priority enrollment through the Admissions & Records Office.

## **Group B:** All other matriculated continuing, new and returning students

To receive and maintain priority enrollment, new and continuing Group B students must do of the following:

- ✎ Complete assessments, orientation and advisement (*see pages 6–8 for details*);
- ✎ Complete an education plan prior to completion of 15 units or third semester, whichever comes first (*see page 8 for details*);
- ✎ Maintain good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA;
- ✎ Complete at least 50 percent of enrolled units; and
- ✎ Not exceed 90 degree-applicable units.

## **Group C:** Continuing, new and returning students who have not matriculated (including those in Group A and Group B)

## **Group D:** Probationary students

Any student who has been on probation for at least two consecutive semesters, including students on academic probation (GPA-based) or progress probation (based on the percentage of courses completed with an evaluative grade).

## **Group E:** Students over 90 units

Students who have completed more than 90 units with a grade of A–F, P or NP. Courses considered “basic skills” will not be counted toward the completion of units in this category (although they will count toward accumulation of units in Groups B and C).

## **Group F:** Concurrently enrolled high school students

Concurrently enrolled high school students are restricted from enrolling early and may only enroll approximately two weeks prior to the start of the term.

The number of units you have completed at MiraCosta College determines your enrollment priority. For Groups B and C, this includes all courses completed, including basic skills and ESL classes. Students who have completed 90.5 units or more in degree applicable courses will be assigned to Group E.

Appointments are assigned randomly within each group and start at 8 a.m. Enroll at your appointment date and time or any time after throughout the enrollment period.

# FEEES: INFORMATION, POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Everything you need to know about fees is at [miracosta.edu/fees](http://miracosta.edu/fees), but here is a brief roundup.

## Fees for 2016–2017

- ✦ **Enrollment Fees** \$46 per unit for California residents. Concurrently enrolled high school students are exempt from paying enrollment fees.
- ✦ **Tuition for non-California residents** \$257 per unit for the fall, spring and summer semesters.
- ✦ **Health Services Fee** \$16 for the summer and \$19 for the fall and spring semesters.
- ✦ **Student Center Fee** \$1 per unit, up to \$10 per year.
- ✦ **Student ID Card Fee** (optional) \$6.
- ✦ **Parking Permit Fee** (optional) \$17.50 for a car and \$9 for a motorcycle in the summer. \$35 for a car and \$17.50 for a motorcycle in the fall and spring semesters.

**Payment of Fees** Fees are due at the time of enrollment and can be paid on **SURF** by using a Visa, MasterCard or Discover card. If you choose not to pay online, you must pay immediately after enrolling at the Student Accounts Office (Bldg. 3200 on the Oceanside Campus and Bldg. 800 on the San Elijo Campus). Unpaid course fees or other debts may result in being dropped from classes and a “hold” being placed on your account. This will prevent you from adding classes and accessing other services, such as requesting a transcript or enrollment verification.

**Returned Check Policy** A penalty of \$10 will be charged for each check dishonored by the bank and returned to the college. This penalty is in addition to any and all other fees, fines and charges.

**Delinquent Debt Collection Charge** When fees are not paid, the fees owed are past due and subject to the collections process. If a delinquent debt is sent to collections, a reasonable collection cost of up to 25 percent may be added to the balance owed. Delinquent accounts may also be reported to one or more of the national credit bureaus.

**Scholarship Recipients** If you received a scholarship, call or visit the Scholarship Office before making any payments. The Scholarship Office is located in Bldg. 3000 on the Oceanside Campus. Phone: **760.795.6751**.

**Military Tuition Assistance** Students planning to use Military Tuition Assistance must contact the Joint Education Office on base to obtain authorization forms.

## Five Reasons to Fill Out the FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for the following:

1. **Pell Grant and Federal Supplemental Grant (FSEOG)**  
These grants are financial assistance based on need and other criteria. They do not have to be repaid.
2. **Cal Grant** These grants are for students who meet the financial, academic, and eligibility requirements, and apply on time.
3. **Board of Governors (BOG) Fee Waiver**
4. **Federal Work Study (FWS)** Students earn money through part-time employment on campus.
5. **Direct Loans** Students must complete a FAFSA before applying for a loan and are responsible for repayment when the loan comes due.

## Undocumented Students

If you are an undocumented student and cannot complete the FAFSA, you may complete the California Dream Act Application at [dream.csac.ca.gov](http://dream.csac.ca.gov).

### Important

- Financial aid is based on enrollment status as of the add/drop date. Waitlisted classes do not count.
- Students who withdraw after the add/drop date may be required to repay a portion of their financial aid funds.

**4 Review**  
Once your To-Do List is complete your file will be reviewed to confirm eligibility. Reviews can take between 3-6 weeks to complete.

**5 Collect**  
Financial Aid is paid through HigherOne disbursement services. You may choose direct deposit or a paper check.



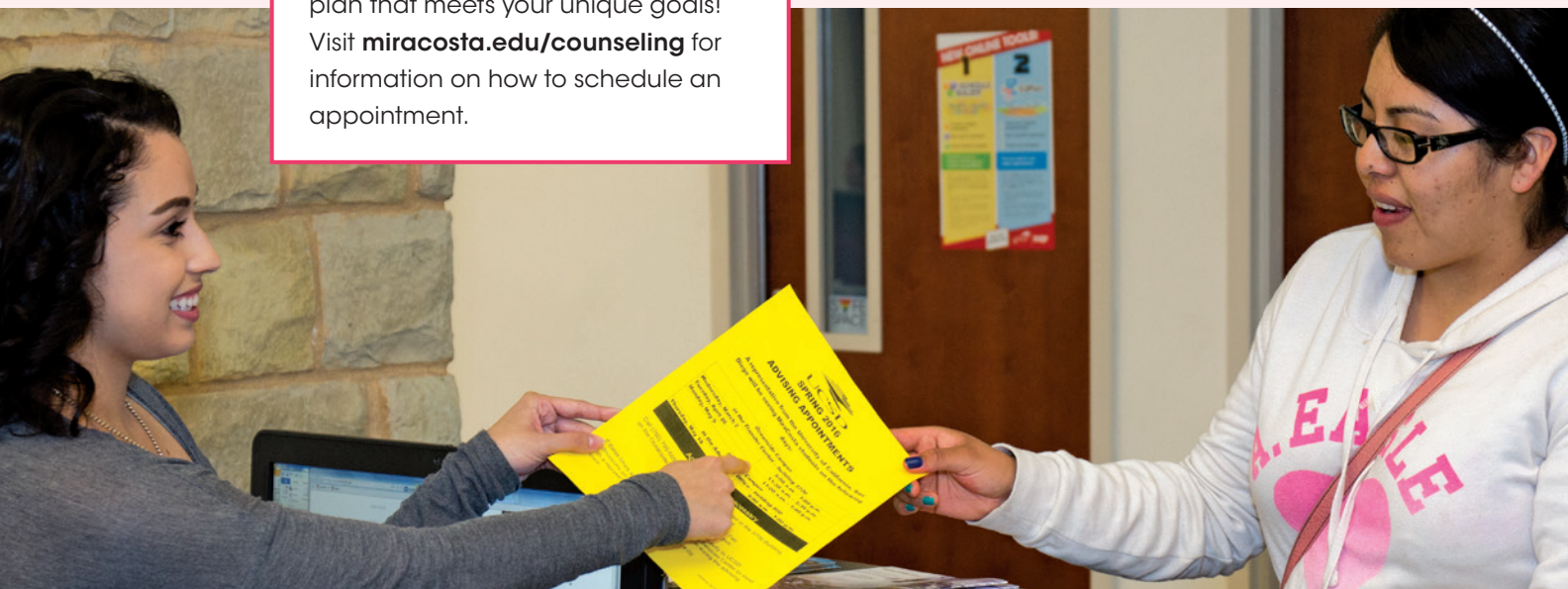

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

This general education certification pattern can be subject to change year by year, but students are assured that courses taken to meet this pattern will be honored if they are approved for the academic year that the course is completed. **Courses on this list are approved effective Fall 2016 and are valid through Summer 2017.**

IGETC is not a UC admission requirement but is advantageous to many but not all transfer students. Students should work with a MiraCosta College counselor to develop an educational plan that includes general education and major preparation course work specific to the intended UC campus.

All courses on IGETC must be completed with a "C" or better. A "P" (pass) is acceptable, but UC permits no more than 14 semester transferable units to be completed on a pass/no pass basis.

UC credit may be limited for some courses. For example, no credit is given for an introductory course if it is taken after a more advanced college course. Credit may also be limited for courses with overlapping content. In addition, duplicate credit will not be awarded for the honors and non-honors versions of a course. UC credit limitations are noted on the catalog course descriptions.

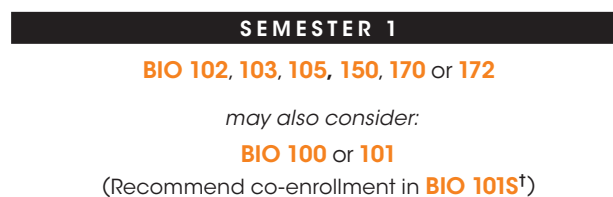

Suggested biology course sequence for students entering RN, BS in nursing, OT/PT, dental hygiene or physician assistant programs:



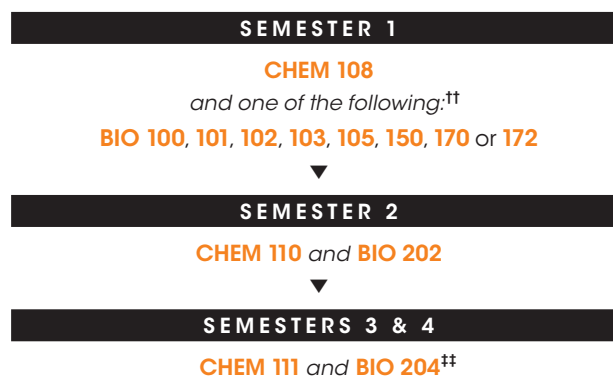

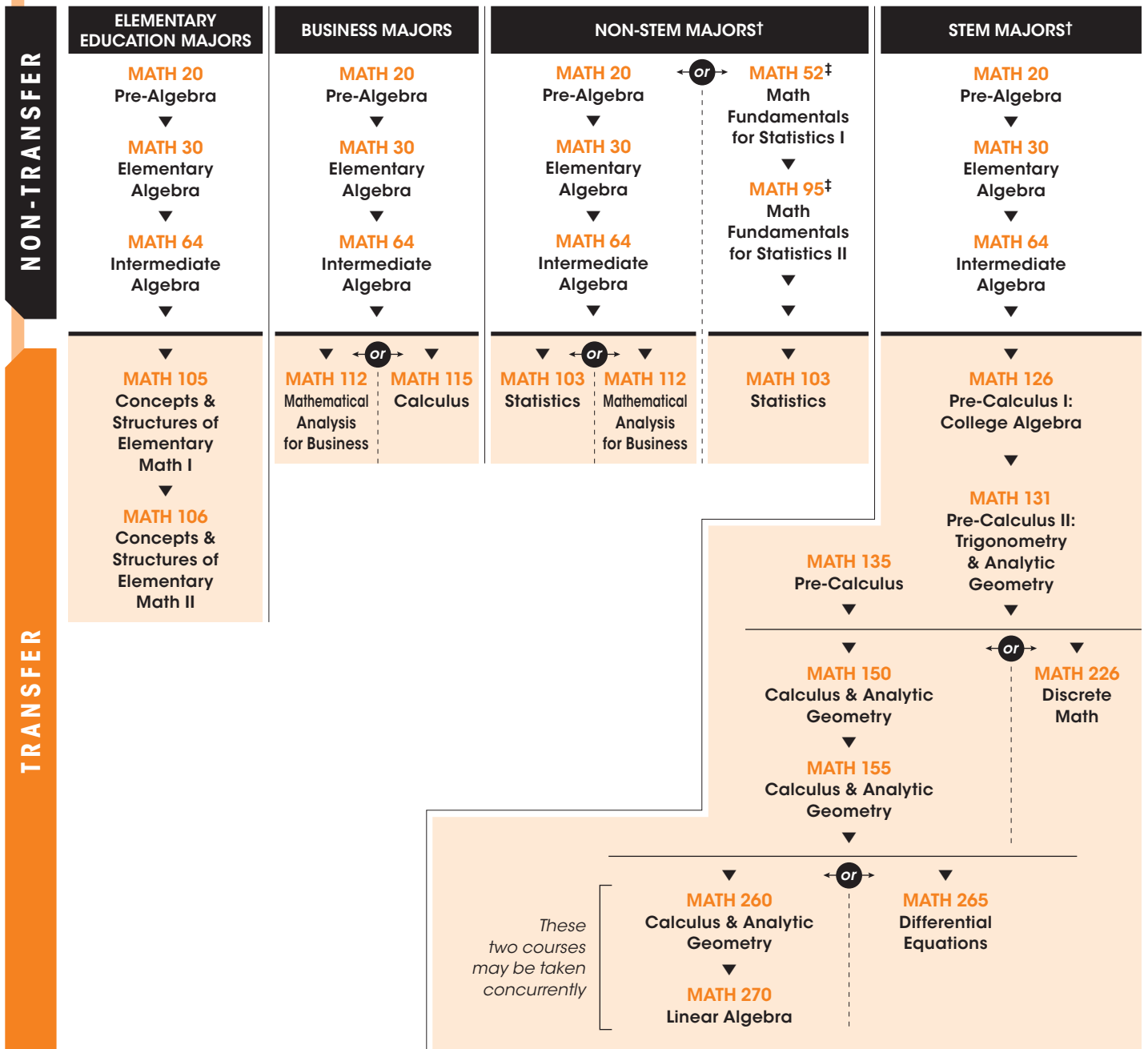

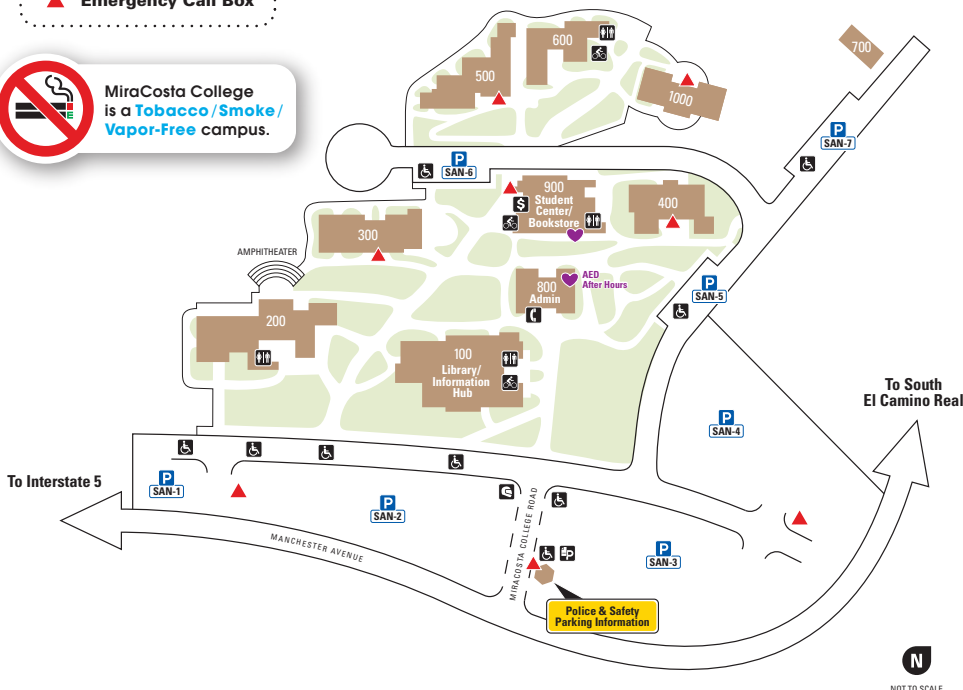
