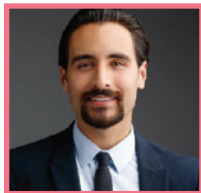
ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

The Administration of Justice Program at MiraCosta gives students both the theoretical and hands-on experience needed to establish a career in administration of justice.

Administration of Justice is the study of the structure, functions, laws/procedures, and decision-making processes of those agencies that deal with the management of crime—the police, prosecutors, courts, and correctional facilities.

With flexible courses that meet days, evenings, weekends and online, students can take courses in law enforcement, corrections, private security, and other related fields.

Students may take courses in administration of justice to prepare for a major in criminal justice, criminology or law enforcement, or to fulfill general education requirements. Courses are also of interest to professionals working in law enforcement, corrections, or other related fields.
