

ELIGIBILITY & PROGRAM APPLICATION

- Complete an application for MiraCosta College: miracosta.edu/apply.
- 2. Complete a SAS Program Application found on the SAS website: miracosta.edu/sasapplication.
- 3. Email verification of disability or medical condition to sas@miracosta.edu. Verification can include:
 - a doctor's note on professional letterhead identifying a medical diagnosis, the most recent Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan from high school,
 - a completed SAS Verification of Disability Form filled out by your doctor if you do not have any medical documentation in your immediate possession,
 - a Disability Rating from the Veteran Affairs Department.

After completing steps 1–3, call or email the SAS office to schedule a Welcome Meeting.

LEARNING DISABILITY ASSESSMENT

- A Learning Disability (LD) assessment may be available for students who have experienced lifelong challenges with academics and have not received support through an IEP or 504 Plan in high school.
- Students and an LD Specialist work together to identify tools and strategies to support learning.
- LD assessments are free.

SUPPORT COURSES

COUN 100 (fall semester only)—This course teaches success strategies to enhance academic and lifelong learning, while integrating career and academic planning.

LRNS 42—This course emphasizes visual and auditory processing skills through work in mathematics as recommended by individualized plans, compensatory techniques, learning strategies, and self-advocacy.

LRNS 46—This course prepares students to write clear and organized sentences, paragraphs, and essays in a highly supported setting.
