Students seeking to enroll in courses who are under eighteen (18) years of age, have not completed high school, and are not pursuing the equivalent of a high school education, may submit a minor's petition to determine eligibility to take credit and/or noncredit courses. If you are currently enrolled in high school, you must complete the Concurrent and Dual Enrollment Permit in the Admissions and Records Office (no Minor's Petition required).

The student and a parent/guardian must meet with the dean of Counseling and Student Development or designee to determine eligibility. Approval of a minor's petition does not guarantee enrollment in a class. Students must go through the enrollment process and are subject to all requirements including but not limited to prerequisites, corequisites, audition and other enrollment restrictions. For courses with associated fees, students are responsible for paying all fees at the time of enrollment including but not limited to: the enrollment fee, health fee, student center fee and when applicable, the non-resident fee.

Per State Education Code 76001, students admitted using the Minor's Petition process must be assigned a low enrollment priority (approximately two weeks prior to the start of the fall or spring term and one week prior to summer) so as not to displace regularly admitted students.

Notice to Minor Students/Parents/Guardians

Communication between MiraCosta College and minor students is important to ensure a positive educational experience. As such, we want to make sure that both students and parents/guardians are aware of important information and policies.

Parents should be aware that per section 99.5 of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (a federal policy), when a minor student becomes a student at any college all rights accorded to, and consent required of, parents transfer to the student. That is, parents do not have the right to inspect the minor student's records or gain access to information related to their attendance at MiraCosta College.

Minor students and their parents/guardians must also understand that they are entering a college environment, which is designed with adults in mind. Thus, the atmosphere of the campus in general, and of classrooms in particular, will frequently reflect an adult population.

Students should be aware that:

- Courses may have frank discussions about sensitive topics
- Audio-visual presentations may be graphic in their content
- Students may be exposed to adult language outside of the classroom
- Students may access pregnancy tests, HIV testing, and condoms through Health Services at the Oceanside campus on Barnard and the San Elijo campus
- Instructors cannot inform anyone, including parents, of last minute class cancellations or early class releases. If classes are released early, instructors cannot sit with underage students while they wait to be picked up.
- MiraCosta College is not responsible for providing transportation or instructional materials to students.

It is important to the college that minor students and their parents/guardians understand what a college setting is like so that they can have a safe and positive educational experience at MiraCosta College. If MiraCosta College units are required for high school graduation, at the end of the current semester the student will need to request that an official transcript be sent to the high school.

Rights and Responsibilities of Students
