	<b>CalWORKs</b> The CalWORKs program at MiraCosta Community College provides comprehensive student support services for CalWORKs participants. 	<b>EOPS</b> Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) is a state-funded program established to encourage the enrollment, retention, graduation and transfer of students disadvantaged by language barriers and/or social, economic and educational circumstances. EOPS services are designed to give students individualized attention and support as they work to achieve their academic goals. <a href="https://miracosta.edu/eops">Find more information at miracosta.edu/eops.</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Enroll in 12* or more units</li><li>• Be eligible for the California College Promise Grant (CCPG) "A" or "B"</li><li>• Be a California resident or meet AB540/California Dream Act requirements.</li><li>• Be educationally or socially disadvantaged as determined by mandated state regulations AND</li><li>• Not have completed 70 degree-applicable units of college coursework.</li></ul> <p>*Exceptions are made for students with verification from Student Accessibility Services (SAS).</p>
	<b>CARE</b> The Campus Assessment, Resources and Education (CARE) Team is committed to taking a holistic approach to help our students succeed while addressing any challenges they may be experiencing to meet their basic needs such as food, housing, transportation, mental health, childcare, legal aid, etc. On-campus and off-campus resources are often provided to students to help meet their short-term and long-term needs with the goal of improving the outcomes of their academic and personal success. <a href="https://miracosta.edu/care">Find more information at miracosta.edu/care.</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• CARE resources and assistance are available to all MiraCosta College students</li></ul>
	<b>ASE Programs</b> Academic Success and Equity (ASE) Programs intentionally center communities that have been historically marginalized in traditional higher education settings: students who are Black & African-American, Latinx & Chicanx, Native Hawaiian & Pacific Islander, Undocumented, DACAmented, and former foster youth. 	<b>RAFFY</b> Resources & Assistance for Former Foster Youth (RAFFY) is a MiraCosta College program that arose out of a state wide initiative, designed to assist potential college students emancipated out of the foster care system. <a href="https://miracosta.edu/raffy">Find more information at miracosta.edu/raffy.</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Must be a current or former Foster Youth</li><li>• Participants must attend RAFFY specific orientation, meet monthly with RAFFY Counselor, attend RAFFY approved workshop and submit a mid-term progress report each semester</li></ul>
