



PRONOUNS GUIDE

What are pronouns?

Pronouns replace a noun in a sentence. It refers to either the person talking or someone or something that is being talked about. There's are different types of pronouns that fulfill different functions, such as reflective, indefinite, and possessive pronouns. For our purposes we will focus on personal pronouns and their connection to gender identity.

We're familiar with the personal pronouns she/her and he/him. These pronouns reflect a binary understanding of gender. Since gender exists on a broad spectrum, our use of personal pronouns should reflect the diverse ways that people can identify their gender. Check out the Nonbinary Pronouns Chart below ot learn a few examples of nonbinary pronouns and how to use them.

5 Things You Can do Today!

- Share your pronouns in your email signature zoom name, and introductions
- Provide opportunities for students to share their pronouns
- Avoid misgender people and when you do apologize
- Use name tags at events that have a space for people to share pronouns
- Practice using nonbinary pronouns in daily conversations

Does everyone use pronouns?

Did you know that some people don't identify with a gender at all? For agender people using any gender pronoun does not fit their identity. In these instances that person may request that you use their name in lieu of a pronoun.
