

# OPPORTUNITY TO TEACH ABROAD

The Study Abroad Consortium of the San Diego and Imperial Counties Community College Association (SDICCCA) is pleased to announce an opportunity for tenured faculty of its member institutions to participate in a Consortium-sponsored program: Fall 2009 Semester Abroad in **Paris, France** for which Cuyamaca College will be the lead college.

The consortium is soliciting applications from instructors in the areas of Fine Arts, English Communication, Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences as identified in the Cuyamaca IGETC course list (see below). Tenured faculty members are eligible to apply if they have not taught abroad within the last five years.

Two faculty members will be selected based on such criteria as 1) appropriateness of teaching their proposed IGETC classes abroad. *Please use Cuyamaca College's course titles and numbers for your proposed courses. Refer to Cuyamaca's web site for electronic access to their current catalog [www.cuyamaca.edu](http://www.cuyamaca.edu)*, 2) their proposed adaptation of courses to delivery in the country selected, 3) experience in and/or knowledge of the host country, 4) demonstrated cultural awareness, sensitivity, and competence, 5) experience as a group leader including problem solving, 6) **a strong desire to work with students during extracurricular activities** 7) awareness of and competence in non-academic roles to be assumed during the program.

Committee members plan to interview faculty for this opportunity mid October.

#### **Program information:**

1. **Time frame:** Projected time frame for the fall semester in France is **mid-October to mid-December 2009 with classes beginning at Cuyamaca College.**
2. **Load:** Faculty selected to teach abroad must teach a full load that meets IGETC requirements, which typically requires four preps. Your proposed courses must transfer to the California State University and/or the University of California. The shortened semester requires more contact hours per week. **As mentioned earlier please review Cuyamaca's IGETC list below for course titles and numbers or refer to the online Cuyamaca catalog on their website [www.cuyamaca.edu](http://www.cuyamaca.edu).**

3. **Provisions:** Round trip airfare, ground transportation, excursions, and housing are included as part of the program for each faculty member. A representative from the Consortium will contact selected faculty members to discuss details and schedule an orientation meeting.

To be considered for selection, the attached application with the appropriate signatures from your Department Chair, Dean and the VP of Instruction at your campus, a curriculum vitae, and a fifty-word biography must be received (in hardcopy) in the office of Dr. Lyn Neylon, Study Abroad Program Coordinator, Room B355, Cuyamaca College, 900 Rancho San Diego Parkway, El Cajon, CA 92019 no later than **Wednesday October 1, 2008 at 4:00 p.m.**
