## **Syllabus**

Course: Business 140

Legal Environment of Business

## Course Description:

This course will introduce students to the American Legal System and to the legal environment of conducting business today. The course will survey the various sources of law, along with the ethical and social influences impacting the conduct of business.

Scope of this course includes business legal systems, sources of law, social and ethical influences, judicial and administrative systems, contracts, torts, bankruptcy, agency, business organizations, securities regulation, regulation of property and protection of intellectual property interests.

## **Course Objectives:**

To provide the student with an introduction to the basic areas of law which have an impact on the conduct of business.

Students will be able to:

- a. identify the economic and legal environment as it pertains to profit and non profit organizations with consideration of social and political influences as they affect such organizations;
- b. analyze a set of facts to consider legal issues as they pertain to those facts, to use given set of laws in relation to those facts, to apply these rules of law and to come to a proper legal conclusion;
- c. demonstrate a working knowledge and appreciation for the history and general applications of contract law principles;
- d. demonstrate a working knowledge of the court system and the legal process and the scope of judicial review;
- e. develop the ability to reason from a legal perspective;
- f. discuss actual cases involving substantive law applied to fact situations; and
- g. identify ethical considerations and standards of professional conduct.

**Course text:** Essentials of Business Law. 5<sup>th</sup> Edition. Beatty and Samuelson. 2015. Cengage Learning.

**Evaluation**: Students will be graded on the following basis:

- a. <u>Exams</u>: <u>Three</u> tests will be administered during the semester. Two midterms and a final examination. Each test will be worth 100 points each and will consist primarily of objective questions and some essay.
- b. Chapter homework as assigned in "Assignments" on Blackboard.
- c. <u>Case briefs</u>: Students will be expected to brief at least <u>two</u> cases related to the topics and substance covered during class. Each brief will be worth 50 points and will be assigned throughout the semester.
- d. Choose <u>one</u> of the listed <u>projects</u> on Blackboard: This assignment will be worth 100 points.
- e. <u>Movie Assignment</u>: This assignment will be worth 100 points. Students will view a movie feature from a list and complete a report/essay assignment.
- f. <u>Class Participation</u>: Students are encouraged to participate in discussion debate and review sessions throughout the semester.

ALL assignments/projects must be completed.
