



Registering in Classes

students will receive an email outlining additional steps to access SURF, MiraCosta College's online registration and student information management system. Student ID numbers (also known as SURF IDs) are required in order to use the online system. ID numbers are NOT sent to the students. 
Wait Lists



While registering in SURF, students may select the wait list option for a full class. Beginning on the first day of classes, student registration into classes will be at the discretion of the instructor. The student must attend the class on the first day to have an add card signed by

the instructor or be issued a permission number to register for the class.

Attendance at First Class Meeting

To ensure your place in a class, attend the first class meeting on time. Instructors may drop absent students to make room for students wishing to add the class. If you decide not to continue in a class for which you

have registered, it is your responsibility to drop the class officially by using SURF or by submitting a drop card to the Admissions & Records Office at the Community Learning Center.



Class Cancellations

Classes may be canceled due to insufficient enrollment. Every attempt will be made to contact students by email before the class meets. Students do not need to drop a canceled class.

Parking Permits Parking permits are re



Parking permits are required when parking at the Community Learning Center (CLC), Oceanside, and San Elijo campuses Monday–Saturday. All vehicles not displaying a valid permit will be ticketed starting January 27 for spring semester. Students may not park

in staff spaces. Parking permits may be purchased for \$17.50 for the CLC or \$35 for the Oceanside or San Elijo Campuses. Parking permits purchased for the CLC are not valid at the Oceanside and San Elijo campuses.

Vending machines that sell day passes are located at all three campuses. A Community Learning Center day pass may be purchased for 50 cents and the San Elijo and Oceanside Campus day passes may be purchased for \$1. All visitors must purchase a day pass Monday-Saturday. Parking permits are non-refundable once purchased.

TYPES OF CLASSES

While most noncredit courses are offered in a traditional face-to-face format, some are offered online or as hybrids and meet the same academic requirements as the on-campus counterparts. Students should be familiar with each format before registering to ensure they choose the classes that best fit their learning styles and academic needs.



Face-to-face classes require in-person weekly meetings.* Students receive in-person instruction and may be assigned homework to complete online or outside of class.





Hybrid classes at MiraCosta College require both in-person meetings* and online activity which takes the place of some "seat time." For example, if a class meets 50% online, a student may attend class two days per week and complete an additional two days worth of instruction and coursework online.



Fully online classes at MiraCosta require all instruction, coursework, and activities to be completed online. Classes offered 100% online have no face-to-face requirements.

*In-person meetings can take place at the Community Learning Center or at a designated off-site location, so students should note the exact location of all classes before registering.

CAREER & COLLEGE PREPARATION

MiraCosta College offers career and college preparation for students who wish to increase their skills in preparation for college classes, for employment or advancement in the workplace, or for personal growth. These courses are offered in a variety of ways, including open enrollment, face-to-face, hybrid, and 100% online. (An open enrollment class means that students may enroll at any time throughout the semester.)

Prospective students are encouraged to submit a MiraCosta College Application for Admission prior to registering. This can be done online at **miracosta.edu/continuinged** or in person at the Admissions & Records Office of the Community Learning Center (CLC) at 1831 Mission Avenue, Oceanside, CA 92058.

Students may then register for career and college preparation classes using SURF, MiraCosta's online enrollment program, or in person at the Admissions & Records Office. 
