### Benefits for OUSD Students

- How does a student benefit from taking dual enrollment courses?
  - Receive MiraCosta College credit
  - Have the option of requesting high school credits (10 credits for a 3-unit class)
  - o Receive a weighted letter grade if the course is added to their high school transcript
  - o May use courses towards Honors Graduation Requirements

#### For Surfside Direct Instruction Students

- o Have access to collegiate course experience on high school campus
- Course options are expanded by DE

### Dual Enrollment Registration Process

#### 01 Connect with HS Counselor & Complete Google Form

Student connects with an academic counselor at their high school to begin the process and completes the <u>Google form</u> that corresponds to their high school. View classes at <u>miracosta.edu/dualenroll</u>.



#### 02 Apply to MiraCosta College at miracosta.edu/apply

This is a two-step process:

- Create a CCC Apply account
- Apply to MiraCosta College for Spring 2024



#### 03 Obtain a SURF ID/MCC Student ID

A SURF ID is included in the Welcome email sent by MiraCosta within 2-5 business days. \*Click here for a SURF ID lookup tutorial.

### Dual Enrollment Registration Process

#### 04 Submit CCAP Dual Enrollment Form

• Only one form is required for the duration of a student's attendance at MCC while in HS.



The form requires three signatures: student, parent or guardian (if under 18), and HS principal or designee.

#### 05 Course Registration

MCC Admissions and Records department registers the student into their requested course(s).

#### 01 Connect with HS Counselor

### Concurrent Enrollment Registration Process

#### 04 Submit Concurrent Enrollment Form

Valid for the term(s) listed (Summer/Fall and Spring) and must be resubmitted for subsequent terms of attendance until high school graduation.

- Requires three signatures: student, parent or guardian (if under 18), and HS principal or designee.
- Available at miracosta.edu/forms under "Credit Forms."
  - Print and sign, email completed form to admissions@miracosta.edu
  - Request an Adobe E-signature Form

#### 05 Course Registration

Students register themselves for the classes they have selected and pay online via **SURF**.



### How to Drop a Class

- All students can drop themselves through their SURF account.
  - Go to "Manage Classes" tile
  - On the left pane select "Drop Classes"
  - Select classes to drop
  - Review classes to drop
  - Receive confirmation message
- Dual Enrollment ONLY:
  - Students and/or counselors can send an email to dualenroll@miracosta.edu
    - Must contain:
      - A clear request to be dropped
      - Student's full name
      - SURF ID
      - Class name and section number



### Important Class Deadlines



#### 01 Add/Drop Deadline (10% of course)

- Adding a student after this deadline requires Dean approval (only for extenuating circumstances).
- Dropping a class after the add/drop deadline results in a W grade (withdrawal)

#### 02 Withdrawal (W) Deadline (75% of course)

- Students can drop and receive a W up to the 75%
- After the 75% deadline the student is required to receive an evaluative grade (A,B,C,D,F,P or NP).



# FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy
Act of 1974

A federal law that protects the privacy of educational records of all students enrolled in schools beyond the high school level.

MCC staff and faculty are unable to provide student-specific information to anyone unless the student has given their consent.



Once a student applies to college, the rights on their student record moves from the parent to the student, regardless of the student's age.

### Financial Aid Implications

- Dual enrollment courses count as college courses. They are included in a student's college GPA and factor into total units attempted and completed.
- To be eligible for financial aid in college, students must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA and complete 66.7% of courses attempted with an "A", "B", "C", "D", or "P."
- Failing grades, drops, withdrawals, and incompletes will lower the completion percentage and may have future financial aid implications.
- The important thing to keep in mind is that successful completion of college courses in high school can help students graduate from college earlier.



### MiraCosta Promise



#### Who qualifies?

- o First-time full-time college student
- Must complete a FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application
- o Enroll in 12 units or more each semester
- Must be eligible for in-state tuition

#### For the first two years

- Pays tuition
- o Pays fee
- \$250 book voucher


Students who have taken Dual Enrollment course(s) are still considered first-time full-time college students and are eligible for MiraCosta Promise after they graduate high school



### Canvas

Interactive Learning Management System MCC uses. Similar to Google Classroom.

- Even if class meets in person, students still have a "class" in Canvas
- Once students enroll, they can access their course in Canvas, Courses are usually "published" the week before classes begin
- The goal is to have students log into Canvas before classes start
- All emails, announcements and assignments will be posted in Canvas.
- Instructors post their syllabus in Canvas- a roadmap to the semester
