PLEASE NOTE: In accordance with AB 361, meetings will continue to be conducted in an online format. Members of the public may access the meeting at the link above, and may request to make public comments by using the "raise your hand" feature at the bottom of the webinar screen. Written comments to the committee will not be read aloud during the meeting. Instead, a copy of written comments will be provided to each of the committee members. All public comments must continue to adhere to the Decorum outlined below. Specific instructions on how to provide public comment during a Zoom board meeting can be accessed at the link above. ITEMS ON THE AGENDA: Members of the audience may address the committee on any item listed on the agenda when that agenda item comes up for discussion and/or action.

Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per agenda item and a total of fifteen (15) minutes on any one item, unless waived by the committee. Non-English speakers utilizing a translator will have six (6) minutes to directly address the board. ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA: Members of the audience may address the committee on any topic not on the agenda so long as the topic is within the jurisdiction of the committee. Under the Brown Act, the committee is not permitted to engage in public discussion or take any action on an agenda item not on the agenda, except that members of the committee may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by persons exercising their public testimony rights under Government Code §54954.3. In addition, on their own initiative, or in response to questions posed by the public, a member of the committee may ask a question for clarification. A member of the committee or the committee itself may provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, request staff to report back to the body at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter, or take action to direct staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda. Comments from visitors shall not exceed three (3) minutes unless the committee waives the time limit. Non-English speakers utilizing a translator will have six (6) minutes to directly address the board. The committee may also limit the total amount of time for speakers on a particular topic to fifteen (15) minutes.

DECORUM: Board Policy 2355 requires members of the public to observe order and decorum at meetings and to conduct themselves in a courteous manner, avoiding profanity, obscenity, other abusive language, and threats of violence. The board president, as presiding officer, has the authority to run the meeting, which includes the authority to issue warnings, call for recesses, or clearing the boardroom in the event of disruptive behavior. Speakers shall speak to the issues and refrain from using defamatory or abusive personal remarks that disturb or impede the meeting or exceed the bounds of civility necessary to the conduct of the business of the committee. Government Code section 54954.3(c) establishes that the legislative body of a local agency shall not prohibit public criticism of the policies, procedures, programs, or services of the agency, or of the acts or omissions of the legislative body, and California Penal Code section 403 makes it a misdemeanor for any person to willfully disturb or break up any assembly or meeting with lawful authority.

#### IV. Teleconferencing Meetings Pursuant to AB 361

*The Independent Citizens Bond Oversight Committee will consider whether to authorize teleconferencing meetings pursuant to recent legislation AB 361, since meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees. In order to continue to meet under these abbreviated teleconferencing procedures, AB 361 requires a legislative body to make specified findings not later than 30 days after the first teleconferenced meeting and to make those findings every 30 days thereafter. If more than 30 days pass between meetings, the Committee must adopt initial findings again. The Independent Citizens Bond Oversight Committee will consider the circumstances of the state of emergency and determine if the emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person OR if state and local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing. Suspension of the rules are requested to take action at this meeting.*
