It involves looking at the SLO and helping frame the SLO, make sure it is appropriate for the course that students will understand it, that it can be assessed, and that it also can be linked to core competency and potentially to the program outcome also. Would like to streamline new program outcomes or course outcomes.

B. Chair's Retreat	Myers – shared progress made in the SLO cycle calendar and the chair department information updates. The CSLO assessment report is still being worked on in some departments. Most honors classes aren't assessed, and neither are the 292 or 299 classes. Donna Davis has asked for a more sustainable way for her to enter the assessment data. At the moment, Anthology does not have the capability. RPIE is working on a solution. Some of the CSLO Assessment reports were shared with the committee. For accreditation, we will have this information available and will show how the planning process has continued to evolve. Tarman – building a dashboard based on the data in Anthology. Unfortunately, it will not be a real time report. It will be updated periodically throughout the term. The SLO Assessment report gave people an initial introduction to the report before it became a dashboard. The dashboard will be presented at the fifth Friday event.

Student learning outcomes would be one to work on as a group. Does not impact accreditation status. Myers – suggested we bring upcoming rubrics to show people how to use rubric to assess an assignment. Can have attendees bring their COR or bring an assignment. Thomford – want to make sure that they can assess their program SLOs using their required courses. How are the required courses being decided? Funnel people into helping make that decision. Myers – teach people how to use the value rubric and assess the core competencies (CCs) as a start. Would not be much more work for them to do that to their program. If we can start with the CCs we can get an overarching look. Relevant to map assignments people are using to assess. West – would like to know whether we have a video to share with people to enter their SLO assessment and results. Ragazzo will work on getting an updated video made and posted. Want to collaborate and possibly reword RSE/GP framework through policy, some of those prompts. Also engaging in the procedure and practices work of guided pathways at a very fundamental level.
