Instructions:

Please prepare a Power Point presentation that will run for 5 minutes. Feel free to make suggestions for your respective topic outside of your area of study (generalize if you wish). Laptop computers will be provided at each table, so you may run your presentation from a flash-drive. Keep it brief and simple; not too much text in the PPt presentation.

Additionally, please prepare a one-page handout that will be more informative than the Power Point presentation; summarize your presentation and recommendations. You may want to base your summary loosely on the following outline:

- 1. Title (reflective of your assigned/chosen topic)
- 2. Purpose or Goal(s)
- 3. How you and your colleagues are achieving the stated goal(s)
 - a. What you did and why
 - b. What you have learned through experience/assessment (if applicable)
 - c. Reflections on what is needed to improve student success (this may relate to a change in curriculum, changing the SLOs/methods of assessment, requests made through Institutional Program Review).
 - d. Other (?)

100 copies of your one-page summary will be made and provided at your table as handouts for the "Speed SLOing" participants.

Forward your one-page summary to Mary Bennett by Tuesday January 17 so that she may have copies made for Friday. Or if you cannot make that deadline, contact her and ask for a copy i.d. number from her so that you may submit your summary for copying in time to have them ready for Friday.

Presenters will be placed at tables around the periphery of the cafeteria and provide a brief explanation as the Power Point presentation is shown. The presentations will run from approximately 11am-12 noon. Pam will ring a bell every 5 minutes signaling that the groups should move to the next table. After all participants have completed the timed-visits to each table, we hope that they may want to revisit one or two tables and talk with you.

Presenters qualify for 1-2 hours of flex time plus the amount of time required to facilitate the workshop in the generation of your presentation and summary.
