

Students love their mentors, and research shows that students succeed at much higher rates when they have mentors who understand and can relate to their life experiences and help them navigate the college system (Mirelos-Rios and Garcia 2018). The Redesigning the Student Experience team invites faculty and staff to participate in the design of a model for student mentoring that meets the needs of the 21st century. Many of us mentor students formally (ASE programs, Honors, Internships, etc.) and informally. Your perspectives are valuable to this work. The APIDA Ally Training is a six-week asynchronous Canvas course that asks for a one- to two-hour commitment each week. Through a collection of videos, articles, images, and interactive discussion board forums, this training is designed to enhance participants' awareness of diverse APIDA histories, cultures, identities, and responses to recent influxes of anti-APIDA hate crimes. The training culminates with lessons and activities that will generate ideas for strengthening allyship and advocacy for MiraCosta's—students, faculty, and staff—who identify as APIDA. Here is a preview of the six modules:

**Week 1: Who is APIDA?** Start with some answers to these questions: Who is included under this umbrella acronym? Who are often marginalized and underrepresented within the APIDA community?

**Week 2: History, Part 1** - Learn more about the waves of immigrants and refugees from Asia and the Pacific Islands, as well as the histories of early APIDAs in the U.S.

Week 3: History, Part 2 - Focus on specific histories of militarization, war, and labor that brought people from Asia and the Pacific.

**Week 4: APIDAs Today** - Explore quantitative and qualitative data about APIDAs in our communities and at MiraCosta, featuring video testimonies from students, faculty, and staff.

**Week 5: Celebrating APIDA Excellence** - After digesting the histories and data above, take a week to enjoy the wonderful accomplishments of APIDAs in a variety of fields.

Week 6: Allyship and Solidarity - Discover concrete ways to support APIDAs in your classrooms and on campus.
