



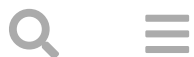
Institutional Program Review Committee (IPRC)

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Mission Statement

IPRC is also responsible for assisting in the execution of the program review process, validating program reviews, and collecting feedback to act on process improvements.

Responsibilities

- Establishing and revising college-wide program review standards and processes;
- Creating and implementing the process for academic program review validation;
- Creating and implementing the process for nonacademic program review validation;
- Incorporating Core Competencies into instructional program review (jointly with AAC) and both Core Competencies and Service Area Outcomes (SAOs) into support and hybrid program review;
- Incorporating Administrative Unit Outcomes (AUOs) into support program review.

Co-Chairs

Co-chaired by a faculty member appointed by the Academic Senate President, and an administrator appointed by the Administrative Council. The Faculty Co-Chair may serve for 3 years, non-renewable. No term limits on the Administrative Co-Chair.

Composition

IPRC is comprised of sixteen members, each selected by the appropriate governance council:

- Seven faculty members (including the co-chair and one associate)
- Four administrators (including the co-chair)
- Four classified staff members
- One student
